Established in 2011 in memory of the late Tsehay Zewde to support all female students with visual impairment attending AA University.





Our graduates find employment in different Government services. Addis Alem is our Program Coordinator. She graduated in 2016 and currently works in the city administration on women and children.





The measure of our success is the significant decrease of the drop out rate among blind female students from 95% to less than 1% since this Program started in 2011.

Four AAU students who did not fulfill their academic requirements transferred to Kotebe Teachers Training College. They are due to graduate in 2021.

The Program will extend its support to 17 new blind female students attending Kotebe Metropolitan University in Addis Abeba.



Many students are encouraged to continue on to the Masters program. Bekelech is our first PhD student, she majored in English language and literature. She commutes from Bishoftu, 61 km south of Addis, to is prepare her doctoral thesis. Bekelech is also a great poet and writer.

An average of 15 scholarship students graduate every year from different departments mainly, Social Studies, Sociology, Law, Languages and Social Needs, Political Science and Folklore.

THE THREE PILLARS OF THE PROGRAM

Each student receives a 3 way support from the Program:

- 1. Financial grant of 900 birr/term
- 2. **Technological support**: 60 digital voice recorders and 35 laptops were distributed todate
- 3. Skills training, including
